TOT Training By Australia Teachers



We are very pleased to share our success of TOT training by Australia teachers at Vera Thomson English School on 11th, 12th, 17th, 18th of April 2019.



We are very glad to join the TOT workshop because it is very useful for every teacher. Every year, the teachers from Australia come and give us precious workshop such as how to plan the lessons, how to prepare the lessons, how to motivate the students and how to check the students' levels and how to solve the unexpected problems that teachers can face in classes.

This year they gave us pronunciation training that we have requested them. Because of our mother tongue interference, we all are weak in pronunciation. We have learnt how to pronounce 24 consonants, 12 vowels and 8 diphthongs and their phonemes to finger spelling. This training has benefitted not only teachers but also our students as we have started teaching our students, depending on their different levels from easy to difficult words once a week. Every Saturday we are being trained online so that we can be more qualified and more confident teachers.
