In September Min Phone San, who is 4 years old had to go to Yangon, because the plasters on his legs were opening, due to the monsoon season, and his poor living conditions. Luckily, he was able to get his legs and feet re-plastered.

He was born with deformed legs and feet, and in February he went to Yangon to have one leg operated on, and both legs and feet put in plaster.

It will be a long process, with more operations, but we hope that he will end up being able to lead a normal life, and now that our school has re-opened he will start attending Pre-School, and he is a bright little boy.



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Zar Ni Win who had to have part of her leg and foot amputated, needed to return to Yangon last month to get a new foot fitted. She can speak good English and we hope that she will be able to find a good job.



Thura Soe aged 3 years old, had one very enlarged eye, and we were able to send him, his mother and grandmother to Yangon for his treatment. He was diagnosed with cancer, and has had 3 chemotherapy treatments, and his eye is now reduced in size, and he is much more comfortable. He will have to have that eye removed, but if he was not treated now, the cancer would have spread.

One of our Pre-school teachers had cancer, and we were able to pay for her chemotherapy treatment, which took over a year. She went back for a check up and has now been give the ALL CLEAR.



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Thet Paing Tun, who we paid for to have an operation on his arm 2 and a half years ago, was in a lot of pain and his arm has become more enlarged. There is a problem with his blood vessels, and he had another operation, and now he is no more pain.

Win Pa Pa who had an operation on both her hands and had her foot and part of her leg amputated at the beginning of this year, went to Sittwe with her grandmother to get a prosthetic foot and leg fitted, and has now returned home.
