We arranged for her to be taken to Yangon by ambulance, which took approximately 12 hours. She needed 2 carers to look after her, and her 2 neighbours who are extremely poor, immediately volunteered to look after her. Her children aged 5, 8 and 12 and a neighbour's child, were looked after by another neighbour who cooked for them.

It is heart-warming to see very poor people who have nothing, helping their neighbour.
