This month 2 pregnant women had to go to Yangon, 15 hours away by bus, to have their babies, as they were going to have difficult births, and the local hospital could not deal with them. Both mothers and babies are well and are now back in Lintha. When a patient goes into hospital, they have to have a carer, which is usually a relative, and so we need to pay for their hospital expenses, plus bus fares and food.

Other patients who had to go to Yangon, was a lady who was going blind in one eye. I am pleased to say that her eye sight has been saved.

One heart patient went to Yangon, but unfortunately at present is unable to have the operation, as she is not fit enough. She is taking medication and we hope she will be able to have the operation in 3 months.

A fisherman who broke his thigh has had a successful operation, and another fisherman had a spinal operation, and is starting to walk again.

One mother who fell from a tree whilst picking fruit had an operation but unfortunately cannot walk unaided. We have bought her a frame so she can manage to walk a little.
