On 4th November 2021 we were able to open our school again, and all the students, teachers and parents are so very happy.

The poor children who have no watches or a clock at home, turn up around 6am, waiting for school to open, as they are so very keen to learn. The first lessons start at 7am and the school closes at 7.30pm.

The Vera Thomson English School is part of The Andrew Clark Trust, a charity registered in England,
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At present there are 777 students and we also have a waiting list. Only 25 students are allowed in a class, and for Pre-school only 20 students are allowed with 2 teachers, as the children are aged between 3 and 5 years old.

Children from 3 to 10 years old learn maths on an ipad. It is a programme called One Billion, which was produced in the UK. 20 students in a class learn maths by only using the ipad, and although a teacher is in charge, the children can learn themselves, and it is very successful.



In 2020 Aaron Meyer, who is a professional violinist from the US came and brought violins for a number of our students, and started to teach the violin. When he returned to the US he was going to continue to teach the students, via online. However because of the Covid situation our school had to close, and only 3 were able to continue. Allie Dunnington from the UK also gives online lessons. They are doing very well, and we look forward to Aaron and Allie being able to visit again, to teach more students.

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All our students learn about the environment, and at present some of our older students are doing a project named Constructive Visions, and when they have finished, one of them will write about it, which we will send you to read.
